




## Reflection



This Sunday, we hear how Jesus is put to death on a cross and how he is laughed at and made fun of by the people watching.

The label above Jesus' cross said he was the king of the Jews. Kings are powerful, but on the cross Jesus seems helpless. He is going to die, and the people can't understand it. We know now that this was all a part of God's plan - Jesus had to die so that we are saved.

Jesus is a very different kind of king. He is the king of love. He gives

us all a chance of new life with him in heaven.

Even when things are bad, when we are frightened, or hurting, upset or lonely, Jesus is right there with us. He knows how it feels to be laughed at, to be sad, to be in pain. And just like he did with the second thief on the cross, he is always willing to love us and to welcome us.

Jesus, the king of love, showed his love for us and for all people by dying on the cross. How do you think we can show our love for others as Jesus asks us to?

**Prayer:** O Lord Jesus Christ, our King and Saviour, may we never forget your love for each one of us. We praise you always. Amen.

# **Advent charity work**

Advent is a time of alms giving. We appreciate this year everybody has been hit by the cost of living crisis so please give if you are able but we do understand some people will not be able to.

Apostleship of the Sea is a registered charity and agency of the Catholic Bishops' Conferences of England & Wales and Scotland that provides pastoral, emotional and practical support, information and a listening ear to seafarers regardless of race and religion who arrive at ports in the Diocese. Each year we have the woolly hat campaign which will launch on 25 November. Please donate items to be packed into the hats such as: Men's socks, men's gloves, shower gel, shaving gel, deodorant, toothbrush, toothpaste, lip balm, disposable razors, small comb, small notepad, pens, chocolate (either a small bar or handful of small chocolates)

Christmas jumper day is on Friday 9 December and children are invited to wear their Christmas jumpers and non uniform and donate £1 to Save the Children.

Each year we work with a charity to provide refugee children with Christmas presents. Good quality presents can be regifted from your bookshelves or toy cupboards or can be new. Each present should be wrapped with a label suggesting the age and gender of the child it would be appropriate for. Donations of presents are asked for from 1-9 December.

At the nativities and carol service, we will be asking for donations for a chosen charity. Father Michael has asked us to collect donations for Mary's Meals.
