



#### Reflection

This Sunday, Jesus tells us a story about some workers who all receive the same wages, even though some worked all day and some just worked for an hour.

Jesus is showing us that God's idea of fairness (sometimes we use the word justice), is different from ours. God's fairness is about making sure that every single person gets what they need, no matter what their situation.

God gives us what we need and not just what others think we deserve. God is generous and created a world with enough for absolutely everyone.

We can try hard not to take more than we need and make sure we don't waste food, water or energy. We can be generous with what we have, like the landowner in the story, sharing what we have with others. And we can try to make a change to our world so that it is a fairer place for all people to live. Sometimes we can make a difference by ourselves. And sometimes we do this by writing to the Prime Minister or other people in power asking them to make the changes.

What will you do this week to try to help make sure that all people around the world get their fair share of the things that God has given for us all?

# Spelling Shed

Another area we are focusing on this year is spelling and we have purchased Spelling Shed for our Key Stage 2 children. All children in Key Stage 2 received a log in last week. They can access games online to practise their spelling skills and the feedback from children and parents has been very positive.

#### **Free School Meals**

All children in Reception, Year 1 or Year 2 at a state funded school or academy, automatically get free school meals through the Universal Infant Free School Meals scheme.

If you receive benefits and your child already gets Universal Infant Free School Meals, you should still register for free school meals. This is so school can claim funding to support your child at school. This is called Pupil Premium. This money is used to fund additional support in school for your child.

Children in Year 3 or above, are only eligible for free school meals if their parents or carers are entitled to benefits, and they make an application for free school meals.

Children who receive free school meals in primary school will still get them when they move to secondary school. Children on free school meals will also get free milk whilst in primary school.
