#### Back to school!

What an amazing first few days at school we have had. It was wonderful to have our first real life whole school collective worship and Mass this week for the first time in 18 months. The children have settled back into school life without bubbles brilliantly and showed real respect for all the new resources the school have had put in place over summer. The Key Stage 2 children have loved using the new fitness equipment in the Key Stage 2 playground and the children in Key Stage 1 have enjoyed reading stories to each other in their new reading area with story circle. We also love the children's virtues that they created for the entrance to school to stand with Mary and our new Hail Mary prayer. The children have done a wondeful job at creating the school mosaic based on Nicola in Year 6's design and when it's finished it will be displayed on the front of school.



### **New Reception children**

It has been lovely to welcome our first 10 Reception children this week. They have settled in brilliantly to our school. Next week we will welcome the rest of our Reception children on Monday and Wednesday. I know the Year 6 buddies can't wait to meet their Reception buddies.

#### Clubs

Now we are no longer restricted to bubbles, the teaching staff will be running clubs for children throughout school. A letter regarding clubs will be sent out on Monday.

### **Nut allergies**

We have a number of children with severe nut allergies in school. Your child must not bring any items into school containing nuts. Please be vigilant especially with packed lunches and snacks to ensure the safety of all the children.



### **Good Shepherd Appeal 2021**

We normally take part in the Bishop's Good Shepherd Appeal during Lent but due to Covid this was delayed. Each school in our Diocese raises money for the appeal and then we attend a Mass to present the cheque to Bishop Marcus. We did some fundraising last academic year but will be having a non uniform day for all the children next Friday, 17 September. The suggested donation is £1 each. We are also having a bun sale for all the children in school on Friday 17 September. We do require donations of buns so if you can donate 6 -12 buns, shop bought or home made by the morning of Thursday 16 September that would be amazing. These will then be sold to the children during the day so children will require money to buy a bun. All buns will be priced at 50p to keep it simple. Please send money in a named envelope especially for the younger children. Any remaining buns will be sold after school.

### School lunches and snacks

The school is part of the Government fruit scheme. This provides every child in Key Stage One and Reception with a free piece of fruit each day. Children are welcome to bring in a piece of fruit for afternoon breaks. Pupils are not allowed to bring chocolate or sweets into school. Children in Key Stage 2 do not receive fruit so should bring a healthy snack into school for their morning break.

Children are encouraged to bring full bottles of water (sports top) to school each day. These can be refilled with chilled water when necessary at school. Please ensure children do not bring juice to school, they will be asked to replace this with water.

If your child brings their own packed lunch, please ensure it is a healthy packed lunch. There should be no chocolate bars or sweets.

#### School uniform reminder

A number of children returned to school with nail polish on this week, please ensure this is removed before children come to school on a Monday, if they wear it on a weekend.

- Children may not wear jewellery to school. Anyone with pierced ears should wear studs during school time.
- Make-up or nail varnish is not allowed in school.
- Long hair should be tied back with either a discreet headband or clips. These should be of a single colour, blue or white, to complement the school uniform.
- Extreme haircuts are not allowed.
- Jumpers and Cardigans must have the school logo on.

### For boys, the uniform is:

- Black shoes and dark coloured socks
- Grey trousers
- · White button-up collared shirt (long or short-sleeved)
- School navy blue jumper with logo
- School tie (elasticated version for KS1 and self-tie version for KS2)

#### For girls, the uniform will be:

- Black shoes
- White socks or grey tights
- Grey skirt/trousers/pinafore (blue gingham dresses may be worn after Easter)
- White button-up collared shirt (long or short-sleeved)
- School navy blue jumper or cardigan with logo
- School tie (elasticated version for KS1 and self-tie version for KS2)



### **Entering and exiting school**

The school car park is for school and parish use only. It should not be used by parents at drop off and pick up including Dawn til Dusk.

Children should enter school down the blue path, not through the car park. Children should not use the play equipment before school or after school for health and safety reasons.

School begins at 8.55am. Please ensure you are lined up in the Key Stage 1 playground at 8.55am. Parents must not cut through the lines when children are entering the school in a morning. This week we had a number of children cut off from their class due to parents walking through the lines. This endangers the safety of our children. If you are in a hurry to leave the school grounds, please walk around the back of the children.

#### **Fence**

The wall between school and the presbytery has needed repair for some time. From Monday, the wall will be demolished and replaced with a fence. The temporary fencing will be moved closer to the path to ensure the safety of the children but please make sure you monitor your children, especially younger siblings, carefully on entry and exit to the school

## **Individual photos**

Don't forget your best smiles on **Thursday 23 September**, the children will be having their individual photos so should come to school in their full school uniform including ties and jumpers or cardigans. Year 1 and Year 5 would normally come to school on a Thursday in P.E. kit. On this occasion, Year 5 should bring your PE kit with them in their bag to change into after the photographs. Year 1 should come to school in school uniform and will have an active session without getting changed.

### **Family Mass**

On Sunday 26 September at 11am, all our families are invited to celebrate Mass at St Mary's. Many of our Year 6 children will be there as part of their confirmation programme but it would be amazing if we could fill the church as we did before Covid. A letter will be sent out nearer the time asking for volunteers to read at the Mass.

### **Knowledge Organisers**

Following the feedback on the parent survey in July, we have printed the knowledge organisers out for Autumn 1 and sent them home today so you can see what your child is learning in their different subjects. The knowledge organisers identify the key knowledge and vocabulary the children will be learning and there are links to books and inspirational people you may want to learn more about. We hope you find them useful to see what your child will be learning. These are also available on the school website. Curriculum newsletters have been sent home today.

### **Macmillan Coffee afternoon**

On Friday 24 September at 2.15pm we will be holding a Macmillan coffee afternoon in the school hall to raise money for Macmillan Cancer Support. All our parents and families are very welcome to join us.

We are once again asking you to donate any cakes or buns to sell but I'm sure you will agree it's a very worthy cause. Any donations should be brought to school by **Wednesday 23 September.** We will sell any left over buns and cakes after school to the children so they may want to bring some money with them.

Please help us to raise as much money as possible. All proceeds will go to Macmillan and the very important work they do.

£48 could help run the Online Community forum for over 3 hours. Typically, that would give nearly 333 people affected by cancer both emotional and practical support.

£100 could pay for a person affected by cancer to attend a health and wellbeing event, providing them with skills to improve the management of these areas in their lives.

£285 could pay for a Macmillan grant that helps a family affected by cancer take a holiday and enjoy precious time together.

£573 could pay for a Macmillan Social Care Worker for a week, helping patients, family members and carers manage the social and practical problems of living with cancer.

£1148 could pay for a Macmillan nurse for a week, helping people living with cancer and their families receive essential medical, practical and emotional support.

If you would like your child to receive the nasal flu vaccine in school please follow this link to complete an online consent form;



### **Covid guidance**

The updated guidance for schools identifies that close contacts of positive cases will now be identified via NHS Test and Trace and schools will no longer be expected to undertake contact tracing.

As with positive cases in any other setting, NHS Test and Trace will work with the positive case and/or their parent to identify close contacts. Contacts from a school setting will only be traced by NHS Test and Trace where the positive case and/or their parent specifically identifies the individual as being a close contact.

Children are not required to self-isolate if they live in the same household as someone with COVID-19, or are a close contact of someone with COVID-19, and any of the following apply:

- · they are fully vaccinated
- they are below the age of 18 years and 6 months
- they have taken part in or are currently part of an approved COVID-19 vaccine trial
- they are not able to get vaccinated for medical reasons

Instead, they will be contacted by NHS Test and Trace, informed they have been in close contact with a positive case and advised to take a <u>PCR test</u>. We would encourage all individuals to take a PCR test if advised to do so.

The main symptoms of COVID-19 are:

- a high temperature
- a new, continuous cough this means coughing a lot, for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours
- a loss or change to sense of smell or taste this means they cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

If your child has any of the <u>main symptoms of COVID-19</u>, even if they're mild:

Get a PCR test (test that is sent to a lab) to check if they have COVID-19 as soon as possible.

Your child should stay at home and not have visitors (self-isolate) until you get the test result – they can only leave home to have the test. Check if you and anyone else your child lives with need to self-isolate.
