



#### Reflection

This Sunday, is the feast of Christ the King. Jesus didn't live in a palace or wear a gold crown, so what kind of king is he?

Pilate asks Jesus if he is king of the Jews. Jesus answers that his kingdom is not of this world. Jesus' kingdom isn't on earth. We can't see it. Jesus doesn't wear a crown or have lots of riches. He doesn't live in a palace with lots of servants. Jesus was born in a stable and mostly lived a normal life in a carpenter's family.

We cannot see his kingdom and he doesn't behave like a normal king. And yet, Jesus is a very special king, because he is the Son of God.

Jesus shows us that you do not have to be rich or powerful to be important. He shows us that what is more important is how you treat others. What we do and say is much more important than whether we are rich or poor, or where we come from.

This week, let's try really hard to listen carefully to everyone. And most importantly, let's try really hard to listen to Jesus, a very different kind of king, and to the truth that God loves us all.

**Prayer:** God of all, you sent your Son to show us how to live. Help us to listen to the truth and to follow Jesus' example in our lives. Amen.

# Christmas is a coming

We are entering a very special and very busy time in our school year as we enter the season of Advent very soon.

**Nativities** – The Reception nativity is on 9<sup>th</sup> **December at 2.30pm** and the Year 1 and Year 2 nativity is on 7<sup>th</sup> **December at 2.15pm** in the school hall. We are limiting tickets to **2 tickets per child** to reduce the number of people in the school hall but we will record both nativities and send the link to parents to share with family members. Each ticket is £1 and money should be sent into school in a named envelope. Tickets will be on sale from Friday 26 November and these will then be sent home with the children. We also request that unless exempt, all family members wear a mask when in school. Currently we do not plan to do refreshments after the nativity to reduce the risk of spreading Covid.

**Carol service –** The carol service for Key Stage 2 is on **Monday 13 November at 5pm**. Children should be brought back to school, in school uniform and dropped at their classroom door by **4.40pm**. Parents and family members are asked to wear masks in church. There is no limit on numbers for the carol service as there is more space in the church. Currently we do not plan to do refreshments after the carol service to reduce the risk of spreading Covid.

**Jesse Tree Assemblies –** Our Mini Vinnies will begin our daily Jesse Tree assemblies on Monday 29 November. The children will come together each day as we count down to the birth of Jesus by listening to stories from the bible.
