




#### Reflection



This Sunday, Jesus tells us a story about a Pharisee and a Tax Collector which teaches us how to pray and have a good heart. The Pharisee is full of pride. He thinks he's brilliant, that he's done everything right and that God must love him very much. Then a tax collector comes to pray. But what does he say and how does he feel? The tax collector is humble and ashamed. He knows he has done wrong and he asks God for forgiveness.

important as what is in our hearts, what we're thinking and feeling deep down.
