
#### **Cold weather**

# **Punctuality**

We have a number of parents who are regularly arriving at school late. Your child should be in the line at 8.55am. We will be referring parents who are persistently late to Horsforth Children Services to be monitored by the attendance officer from November. When your child misses the first 10 minutes of every day, they miss interventions, lessons and the start of the school day where the teachers discuss what will happen throughout the day. Over a half term, those children who are routinely 10 minutes late to school, miss the equivalent of an entire school day. This also has an impact on the office staff who routinely spend the first half an hour of the school day, taking children to their classes due to lateness. Please ensure you are on time, every day, to help your child have the best day they possibly can.

What an amazing start to the school year we have had with the school birthday, black history month, class masses, Harvest, Macmillan coffee morning, Good Shepherd bun sale, Year 6 residential, parents evening and English parent meetings. #### **Parents Evening**

Thank you to all those who were able to attend the Parents Evening this week. It was wonderful to be able to welcome you into the school to see your children's books and feedback how well the children have settled into their new year groups and the progress they have already made. The feedback from parents was very positive and welcomed by the staff. 88% of parents felt knowing about their child's wellbeing and engagement was extremely important to know about in parents evening.

The overall comments were very positive and gratefully received by the teachers and we are so pleased that the additional things we do, such as English meetings are useful to parents.

A small number of parents said they would like to know more about what their child is doing in school. We would suggest following the school on Twitter as all classes regularly update this, check the school website for your child's class page and see the knowledge organisers that are on the website and we will send home again in Autumn 2 as this was well received this half term with 94% of parents knowing more about what their children are learning. In December, there are our Advent workshops too where parents or family members can come and do some Advent crafts with the children.

Some parents asked for a homework book for spellings to be stuck in and mental maths sheets rather than bits of paper so we will look into this with each class. A small number of parents asked for more homework too. Two years ago, we did a parent survey regarding homework and the feedback from parents was that access to Times Table Rock Stars/Numbots, reading and spellings were enough for their child, so we stopped additional homework. However, on the school website under remote learning there is a huge list of websites you can use to support your child's learning and on the knowledge organisers there are links to books you can read too.

A small number of parents also requested a longer parents evening session. We are in the minority as a school to give 10 minutes in the first parents evening as many school sonly allocate 5 minutes per child in the initial parent's evening. Although we appreciate that for parents they would like additional time, if each child had 15 minutes, the teachers would only meet 4 parents in 1 hour so would need to do 4 parents evening, twice a year which is unmanageable especially in addition to the parents meetings they do for English and maths and the time it takes to prepare. If there are any concerns, the class teacher will contact you and if you have any concerns, please contact the school office.

80% of parents would prefer the parent meetings via Zoom which allows parents to access it from work or home and for it to be recorded which allows parents to access it at a time that suits them. We have kept the Reception meeting on 2 November for maths as a meeting in school, to allow Miss Roberts to demonstrate to parents but the Key Stage 1 and 2 assessment meetings will be via Zoom at the updated time of 4pm to allow you to get home. We hope that helps parents to attend or watch the meeting to support their children.
